PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS – 24-HOUR URINE COLLECTION TEST



If you have any English language difficulties, please ask staff to book an interpreter. From home contact the Telephone Interpreter Service on 13 1450. Services are provided free of charge. Ask staff if this information is available in your preferred language.

Background Information

The 24-hour urine collection test is designed to give your doctor an indication of how your kidneys are functioning. The pathology collection centre will provide you with a container to store and return your sample.

Warning

Certain specimens require an acid additive in the bottle, do not leave anywhere children will have access. Pour the urine into the bottle carefully so as not to splash any of this acid on your skin, wearing gloves is recommended.

Collection Instructions

1. It is suggested that your urine sample is collected initially into a plastic disposable container (an ice-cream container is ideal) and then transferred into the container provided by Pathology.
2. In the morning empty your bladder into the toilet. Do not save this urine specimen but record the time and date on the provided pathology container.
3. From this time on, save all the urine you pass for the next 24 hours up to and including the final specimen passed at exactly 24 hours after the time recorded on your pathology container. For example, if you emptied your bladder at 8.00 am yesterday you are required to pass urine at exactly 8.00am today and this will be your final collection.
4. The container must be stored in a cool place during the collection and returned to Pathology as soon as possible on completion of collection. Refrigerate specimen if not returning to pathology shortly after collection is completed.
